- Have conversations with trusted adults who know you well to advise and guide you (parents, teachers, ECG Counsellor).
- Decide and act based on your options.

Keep a lookout for some of these signs in your peers or in yourself

How can we support one another?

Having difficult emotions during a stressful and uncertain period is normal. Keep a look out for some of these signs:

- Deliberately avoiding others
- Increased irritability, restlessness, agitation, stress and anxiety
 - Sending or posting moody messages on social media
- Talking about death or dying
 - Reacting differently or gradually losing interest in things they used to like
 - Eating more than usual or having a much reduced appetite
 - Sleep pattern changes with difficulty falling asleep or oversleeping
 - Slowing down of energy levels

Joint Admission Exercise (JAE) Eligibility

- MOE will send to your email on 10 Jan 2025 (Friday) 3pm onwards
- If student is eligible, the email will have an attached Form A
- Form A will contain:
- ✓ Gross aggregate scores for different instituition types and the eligible courses the student can apply for

- Application period is from <u>10 Jan 2025 (Friday) 4pm</u> to <u>15 Jan 2025</u> (<u>Wednesday</u>) 4pm
- Use the **JAE worksheet** as a template to rank up to 12 courses based on your preference.
- Apply through the <u>JAE Internet System</u> (JAE-IS) with your <u>Singpass</u> during the application window.
- Submit application through JAE-IS at http://www.moe.gov.sg/jae
- After submitting, you'll get a verification slip emailed to you via the JAE-IS.
- Use SchoolFinder and CourseFinder

4 Feb (Tuesday) 2025 (tentative date)

You'll receive your JAE posting results on 4 Feb (Tuesday) 2025 via:

- 1. SMS, if you've provided a local mobile number.
- 2. JAE-IS, to be accessed using your Singpass.

- Junior Colleges (JC) and Millennia Institute (MI) may set their own school based criteria for subject offered.
- Check the website of respective JC and MI for more details on subject combinations.

- Some Polytechnic/ITE courses may require students to meet non-academic requirements.
- Research on these requirements to make informed choices.

- Successful Direct School Admission for Junior College (DSA-JC) and polytechnic and ITE Early Admission Exercise (EAE) students are not eligible to participate in JAE.
- Students are expected to honour their commitment to the DSA-JC school or chosen polytechnic/ITE course for the duration of the programme that they are admitted to.






